Parish Council Notes

COUNCIL UPDATE

2023 marks my 40th year of service to you as a Parish Councillor. Since joining Pimperne Parish Council in 1983 there have been so many changes that have affected us all. I often remember all the brilliant Councillors who have served the Council over the years. It must be remembered that all Parish Councillors are Their wisdom, friendship and volunteers. integrity have contributed to the great spirit of Pimperne that we experience today. We have a tradition of extremely efficient and personable Parish Clerks over the years. Our present Clerk, Mrs Jan Fairman carries our tradition onward with friendly authority, in depth knowledge and energy.

The First Review of Pimperne Neighbourhood Plan successfully progressed through the examination process without the need for a referendum. The Plan has now been "made" by Dorset Council and

Council Dorset therefore carries "weight" in planning terms when planning applications are under consideration by Dorset Council. Unfortunately, insufficient weight to prevent Dorset Council approving the application for eight electric vehicle charging stations alongside the A354 opposite the junction with Church Road. Objections by the Parish Council. local residents.

attention. Among the many items is the barrier to the school footpath at the junction between Church/Bushes and Newfield roads.

The traffic calming methods to the northern entry to the village on the A354 have been completed by Dorset Council. However, the effectiveness of the methods employed is subject to further review. An incident involving vehicular damage to the Anvil's boundary fence to the A354 was recorded prior to Christmas 2022.

The Parish Council is currently investigating the cost of installation of white gates to verges at entry points on the A354 into Pimperne. The ever-increasing volume of traffic on the A354 (at busy times of the day approximately 1000 vehicles per hour) together with numbers of vehicles exceeding the 30mph speed limit is of constant concern to residents, especially those residing in properties alongside the A354.

Council has had the hybrid application under consideration for

several months.

A meeting has been held by the Parish Council with Mr Andrew Galpin, Dorset Council's Manager for Infrastructure and Delivery Planning concerning the Section 106 contribution by Wyatt Homes for their development, Home Field. As a result, Mr Galpin, together with Wyatt Homes, are determining possible changes to the expenditure within the Agreement that would benefit the residents of Home Field and the wider community.

The site in Chapel Lane, formerly Woodbury Cottage, and the current disused Methodist Chapel continues to be an unkempt eyesore. The rear wall to Woodbury collapsed into a neighbour's property in 2021. The remains of the wall have now been cleared into the Woodbury site by the landowner after considerable delay.

CPRE were unsuccessful with the Northern Area Planning Committee, chaired by Cllr Sherry Jespersen, voting unanimously in favour of the application.

A Neighbourhood Plan objective is to establish a 20mph speed limit on all roads within the village of Pimperne (not the A354). An application in this regard was lodged with Dorset Council in September 2022. Dorset Council policy in connection with speed limits was reviewed in October 2022. Dorset Councillor Sherry Jespersen has confirmed she will follow up our application with the relevant Council officers.

Mr L Mustion was appointed by Dorset Council as our Area Highways Officer in October 2022. A number of highways/footpath items were identified by the Parish Council as requiring The Parish Council, having failed to succeed in the issue of a dilapidation order by Dorset Council, have now requested that Dorset Council issue a Section 215 Untidy Land Order against the landowner.

The play areas adjacent to the Village Hall continue to be enjoyed by our younger community. The Parish Council is concerned that

the play surfaces require attention so soon after provision of additional bark. Different types of play surfaces are being investigated to ensure a more permanent finish.

The conditions of the Parish Council lease for the former school field are to be further considered the current since lease places restrictions on the possible use of the field. In the meantime, saplings obtained from the Woodland Trust are to be planted at the corners of the field.

FLOOD REPORT

An eventful year! The Summer very hot and dry, recently the opposite! The extremely high levels of rainfall resulted in the stream reaching the top of the arch of the bridge over the A354, also there was some back up of water due to the bridges at The Willow, an occurrence noted on previous occasions. The bend in Church Rd

where you can turn onto the A354 extremely was flooded and dangerous due to black ice. Effluent commenced to emerge from manholes like fountains mini along Church Rd, within an hour of being reported to Wessex Water an official arrived to investigate. The percentage of ammonia the in outpourings was very low but surely not acceptable or the other debris emerging. Tankers arrived in an attempt to ease the situation and continued to do so for several weeks. More

CCTV investigations and lining works are due to take place later in

2023 to stop ground water entering the system. However, sorting the problem will not be quick or easy, I have been informed.

A collapsed culvert in a garden in Parr Grove resulted in water being pumped 24/7 into a tributary of the Pimperne stream. Also, pipework along Salisbury Rd, caused concern and again pumping took place.

Newfield Rd became very difficult for pedestrians, in part as drainage ditches and channels were overgrown. I cut a drainage channel at the lower end of Church Rd, to ease the flow of water.

Pimperne was extremely lucky, the Summer being so hot and dry, meant that ground water levels were very low at the start of Autumn/Winter. The Parish Council were able to supply sand and sandbags to residents - stocks will need to be replenished and Dorset Council was able also to provide assistance. If fortune had not been on our side the flooding situation may well have been considerably worse. We must re-double our preparedness for next Winter.

CLIMATE AND ECOLOGICAL EMERGENCY

Last Autumn Peter Slocombe was in the process of investigating the feasibility of installing solar panels on the village hall. Initial surveys had been completed and Peter was awaiting a quotation and further information from a local installer, Tincleton Energy. Unfortunately, no such quotation has been forthcoming and other potential installers are being investigated.

Like it or otherwise the planning application for 8 electric vehicle charging points at Hyde Farm on Salisbury Road has been approved. From 2030 the sale of new diesel and petrol vehicles will be banned while plug-in hybrid vehicles with a 'significant zero emission capability' may be sold until 2035. There is clearly much to be done nationally to implement the government's electric vehicle infrastructure strategy. Whatever you may think personally, now that the charging points have been approved Pimperne can at least demonstrate that it is playing a part in the roll out of electric vehicle charging facilities.

HIGHWAYS AND FOOTPATHS

Footpaths have generally been wellmaintained and continue to provide a well-used outlet for exercise in our lovely Dorset countryside. Please remember to keep to the designated paths which are the only legal access both for humans and dogs. Several parishioners have reported an increase in dog-fouling. **Please Pick Up After Your Dog And Dispose Of It Either In The Provided Dog Bins Or At Home.**

As regards our roads, the signs at the Salisbury end of the village have been moved further up the hill to give motorists more warning to slow down. A speed camera sign has been added. An application has been made to Dorset Council to have a 20 mile per hour limit throughout the village (not the A354) and the Parish Council awaits the outcome.

I have received complaints about cars parked on pavements particularly in the Frampton Road /Boyte Road /Walters Drive area. Although not illegal, the Highway Code states "Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairment, and people with prams and pushchairs." Please be considerate when parking.

Resurfacing of School Lane and other areas of the village will take place in the Spring and hopefully the pedestrian barrier on the footway to school by the playpark will be replaced to ensure the safety of our young children. PUBLIC TRANSPORT UPDATE

USE THE BUSES or LOSE THEM

The Service 20 between Blandford and Salisbury continues as per the advertised timetable which was last updated on Tuesday the 30th August 2022. While I attempt to keep up with any changes, amendments can appear from time to time. If you have access to the internet it is always worth checking the Service 20 timetable on the <u>www.salisburyreds.co.uk</u> or the <u>www.morebus.co.uk</u> websites before travelling.

Talking of bus stops - you may have noticed that the stop and timetable at Letton was completely demolished in a traffic accident. The Damory company timetable has still not reappeared but the Parish Council's timetable is back up on a post by the side of the foot/cycle path.

More seriously the most used bus stop in the Blandford direction. outside the former Farguharson Arms, is to disappear at some point Bayview in the not too distant future. Developments have planning permission to develop the site for four residential units. This includes the installation of front gardens which will be bordered by a wall to the road. In other words the current bus stop would end up in one of the front gardens. Bayview Developments has told the council that Damory are going to reposition it. I feel this is somewhat premature as the bus stop is clearly still currently in use and we have not been informed otherwise by Damory.

When the planning application for the housing made the Parish Council made was representations about the location and importance of the bus stop. It would appear that despite the importance of local public transport, 'bus stops' are not a planning matter. The irony is that both the developer in their application and the planning officer in his report both highlighted the existence of access to local public transport and how this contributed to the site's sustainability. However neither made any comments about relocating the bus stop and retaining it. The Parish Council are in contact with Damory - watch this space!

Here is my usual reminder about additional bus options. The Dorset Community Transport (DCT) Plusbus service starts from Gussage St Andrew and travels via Pimperne to Blandford. The service runs every Thursday on Market day and is primarily for those who are unable to access public transport for any reason, young or old, and including those with limited mobility. The service allows approximately two hours in Blandford before returning. Travellers must register with DCT in the first instance and book their place on the minibus prior to the day. There is currently a fixed return fare of £6.00, however, concessionary bus passes are accepted. This service can be contacted by telephone on 01258 287980 or via email on dorset@ectcharity.co.uk

NORDCAT is a community bus service providing a door-to-door demand responsive service which is open to anyone who has difficulty using public transport and anyone over 60. To be able to use a NORDCAT bus you need to be registered and there is a £5 annual fee although if you have a Bus Pass you will be able to use it on all services. Nordcat can be contacted on 01258 473154 in order to obtain information about current services and to book a seat. The driver will collect passengers from home and an approximate pick up time will be given when booking as times will vary each week depending on who is travelling on any particular day.

In addition to those regular users of the bus I have suggested previously that although many, or even most, Pimperne residents have a car or access to one, we never know when any of us may have to rely on local bus services for whatever the reason.

PIMPERNE'S DEFIBRILLATOR or AEDs



The Village has 2 Defibrillators, AEDs, one in the refurbished telephone box opposite the Farquharson Arms and the other at the Village Hall. When the Ambulance Service is

contacted, if they suspect a heart attack then they will only give the location of the defibrillator if the caller is within 200 metres of its location.

In the event of a suspected cardiac arrest, you should do the following:

Dial 999 or 112 and ask for the ambulance service.

Give them the location of the casualty including postcode, they will also accept *what3words* (W3W) if you have the app. They will direct you to the nearest defibrillator and give you the instructions for opening the storage cabinet.

If you can, get the defibrillator and take it to the casualty.

When the defibrillator is switched on verbal instructions will be given. You cannot hurt anybody by using a defibrillator. The unit cannot


deliver a shock unless the casualty needs a shock.

After the incident, regardless of whether the unit was used or not, PLEASE replace the unit and use one of the phone numbers in/by/near the Defibrillator and tell us, so that we can check and ready the unit to enable it to be used again and the ambulance service can be informed that it is ready, or not, for further use.

To access the defibrillator:



- No Access Code Required
- Rotate knob clockwise
- Pull door open

• Scissors (for cutting away the patient's clothing), a mini towel (for removing sweat from the patient so the pads stick), a disposable razor (for shaving excess chest hair so the pads stick)



and a protective face shield (for safer rescue breaths) are contained within a first aid kit attached to the defibrillator case. The defibrillator cannot be used incorrectly as it will only deliver a shock to the casualty if it detects

that it is necessary.




face shield (for safer rescue breaths) are contained within a clear plastic bag inside the defibrillator case.

Behind the wall and the green gates is a beautiful house and garden, steeped in history!

The original building on this site was a hunting lodge owned by King Henry VIII who in 1543 granted the lodge to Catherine Parr, Henry's sixth wife who fortunately for her outlived the King. Today we still see evidence that this was originally a Tudor house as many features remain even though the hunting lodge burnt down and was rebuilt in 1704.

HOMEWATCH AND SPEEDWATCH

You will not have seen the Speedwatch team out recently. We were advised by the police to take extra care in the cold weather with icy roads so we decided to drop any sessions until it was a little warmer. But, you can expect to see us out again in Pimperne from March onwards. We will also continue to mount sessions in Letton where the 40mph limit is frequently exceeded.

The current statistics from the county as a whole make for interesting reading. The number of cars on the road has increased considerably whilst the rate of those caught speeding has remained pretty constant at 3%. However, if one is waiting to turn onto the A354 from Church Road or Anvil Road, it seems that rather more than 3% of vehicles are speeding.

The police are also mounting a campaign on tackling Anti-Social Behaviour from drivers against Speedwatch teams. Fortunately, we have only had to endure shouting and angry gestures; others in the county have been physically confronted by disgruntled drivers. The village has also not been spared from a series of thefts, particularly from vehicles, and we have been advised that there is a concerted attack in the area by criminals intent on removing catalytic converters. If you have valuable equipment kept in your vehicles, you may wish to consider getting additional safety protection for them.

By the time you read this we will have our new Chief Constable in place and we trust that she and her team will deliver quality policing for us. The police priorities for the local area remain unchanged, being the elimination of Anti-Social Behaviour: stamping down on drug dealing: and prioritising rural crimes. We have yet to see any results arising from the Police and Crime Commissioner's plan to form The Rural Crime Reduction Board with the aim of making Dorset the safest county in the country. I will let you know as soon as I have any more details.
