

7PIMPERNE PARISH COUNCIL

**The Minutes for the above Parish Council Meeting held Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2026.  
7.00pm at Pimperne Village Hall.**

**2. To consider granting dispensations as required:** None required

**3. To approve the minutes of the meeting held on 10<sup>th</sup> December 2025**

-The minutes were approved and signed by the Chairman.

**4. DEMOCRATIC PERIOD:**

-It was reported that loose chippings had been dumped on the grass verge and were sliding down onto the pavement, Cllr Argles to look at this.

-A resident requested that Arleks Lane to be made one way, or have speed humps installed, he had experienced cars pulling into his driveway. The PC explained that they fully sympathise with this issue and that we had raised this with DC Highways many times, most recently last year. DC Highways flatly refuses to make this one way as it will create a greater issue at the bottom of Down Rd, and if Arleks Lane was one way, drivers speed might increase as they will know that vehicles will not be coming towards them. They also have refused to introduce speed humps.

The PC advised that the resident could write to DC Highways directly to explain the problems that he is experiencing.

-2 Representatives from Pimperne Sports Society were present as they are looking for assistance with fund raising for improvement works to the Pavilion and the football pitch, as well as volunteers to assist with the running of the tuck shop. The Chairman had approached Blanchards Bailey to search their archives to find the documentation that establishes the ownership of the Pavilion as it was built in 1996 with National Lottery funding. We await their response.

Meanwhile Andy Jeffery will be looking at the records stored at the Pavilion to see if he can find any related information. The PC thanked Andy and Ollie from Pimperne Sports Society for preparing a document detailing improvements required for the kitchen area in the Pavilion and requested that further information be provided detailing the rest of the improvements works that they wish to obtain funding for.

-The Clerk suggested that the prepare an article for the Spring Village Newsletter outlining their activities, the proposed improvements and appealing for volunteers to help with manning the tuck shop.

-Cllr Tanner reported that the recent hedge trimming on the cycle/footpath to Letton on the A354 had left a lot of vegetation on the pathway and would like the Clerk to write to Mr Taylor to request that it is cleared.

-The PC had received a non-material amendment to the 490 dwellings application. The Chairman reported that further to the disappointment that Pimperne would not benefit from s106 funding related to this application he would be writing to Simon Hoare MP to raise this issue as North Dorset still operates a s106 system whereby the rest of Dorset operates the CIL. It is believed that if North Dorset operated CIL Pimperne would have benefited from funding related to this application. **Chairman**

**-S106 Homefield** –Dorset Council Officer Mr Galpin has confirmed the funding will be available for the following projects on receipt of formal application and required quotation: replacement fencing and gates to the Junior play area/completion of the rubber surface in the play area/ removal of the trampoline and replace with another piece of equipment, remove weed growth and bark to swing area/and the completion of the basketball court.

In the Community Field: funding towards the planned community orchard/ picnic seating/ wildflower area. Mr Galpin has agreed that the funding will be made available, the Clerk and the Chairman to submit the formal applications with the appropriate quotes. Any residual funds must be spent. Chairman proposes to include the pathway of the Community Field. **Chairman/Clerk**

**11. Brief Update:**

**a) Tree Warden Report:**

-PPC approved the removal of the tree guard from the tree in the VH grassed area and place it around the new tree planted at the corner of Church Rd and Bushes Rd. Chairman to arrange with Mr King.

-the 420 saplings planted on the Community field have been well watered in and seem to be doing ok. There is one area which requires stick warnings and coloured material to prevent them from being trampled on, this will be rectified. Further packs will be available February/ March with more saplings being planted as hedging.

-Further to the felling of the diseased Cherry Tree in the churchyard, DC have requested that a replacement Cherry Tree be planted in the same position in the churchyard. **Cllr Beckford**

**b) Flood Warden:**

The stream is flowing, the rain is raining and has been for a few days after the dry spell over Christmas.

Just to make you realise that flooding can occur not just from ground water from the stream or flash flood along the A354 but from other causes.

I received a phone call from a Pimperne resident a few weeks ago asking for assistance as her home and garage were flooding. The reason being that the door to her garage and front door were located at the end of a driveway that inclined towards her property. Mr Alan Lukins and I attended with sand and sandbags and prevented further water ingress. I relay this story to emphasise the need for every householder to undertake a risk assessment as to possible occurrence of flooding situations and that the flooding warning given out by the Environment Agent may not have relevance to anyone particular situation.
